

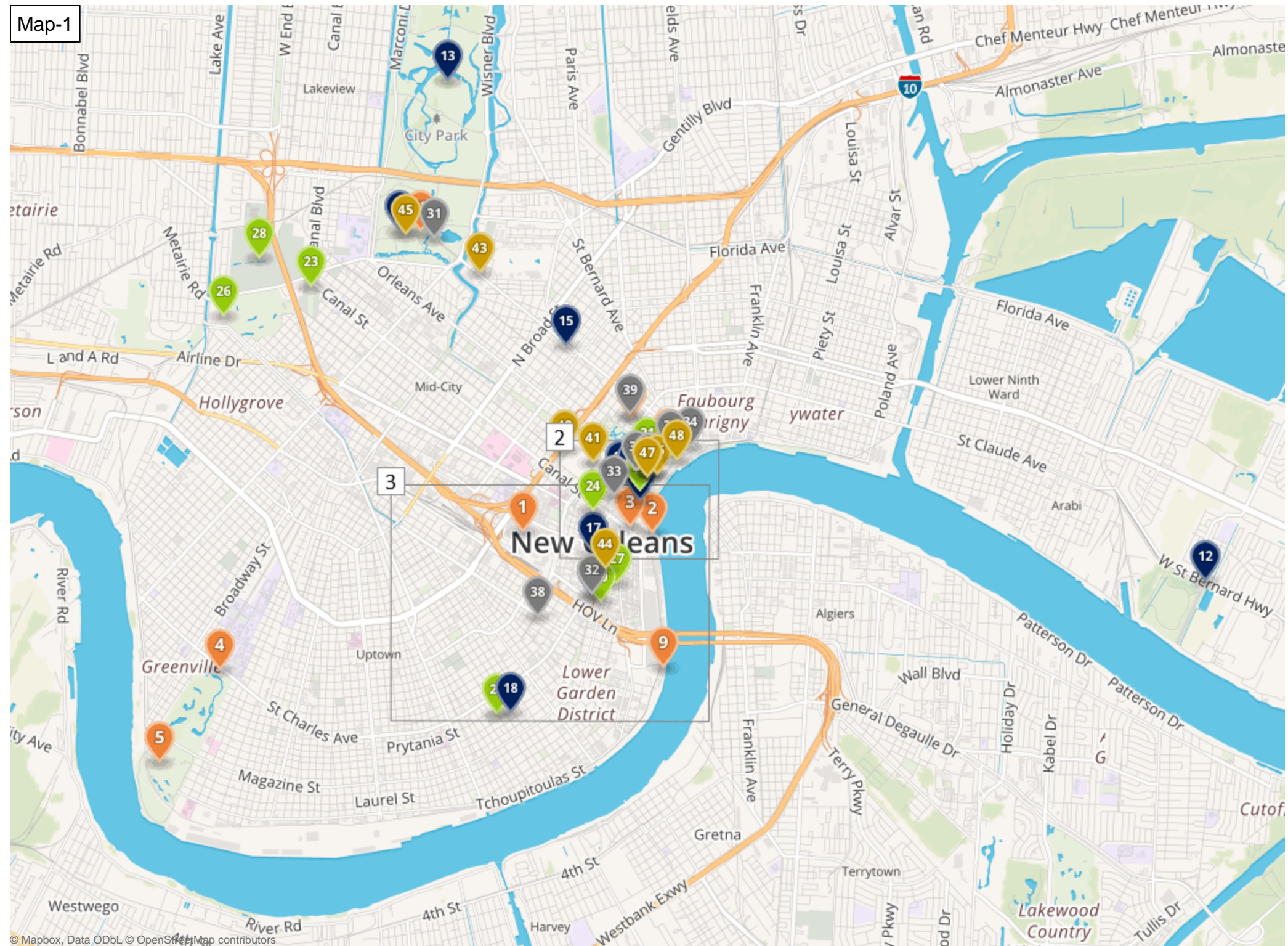

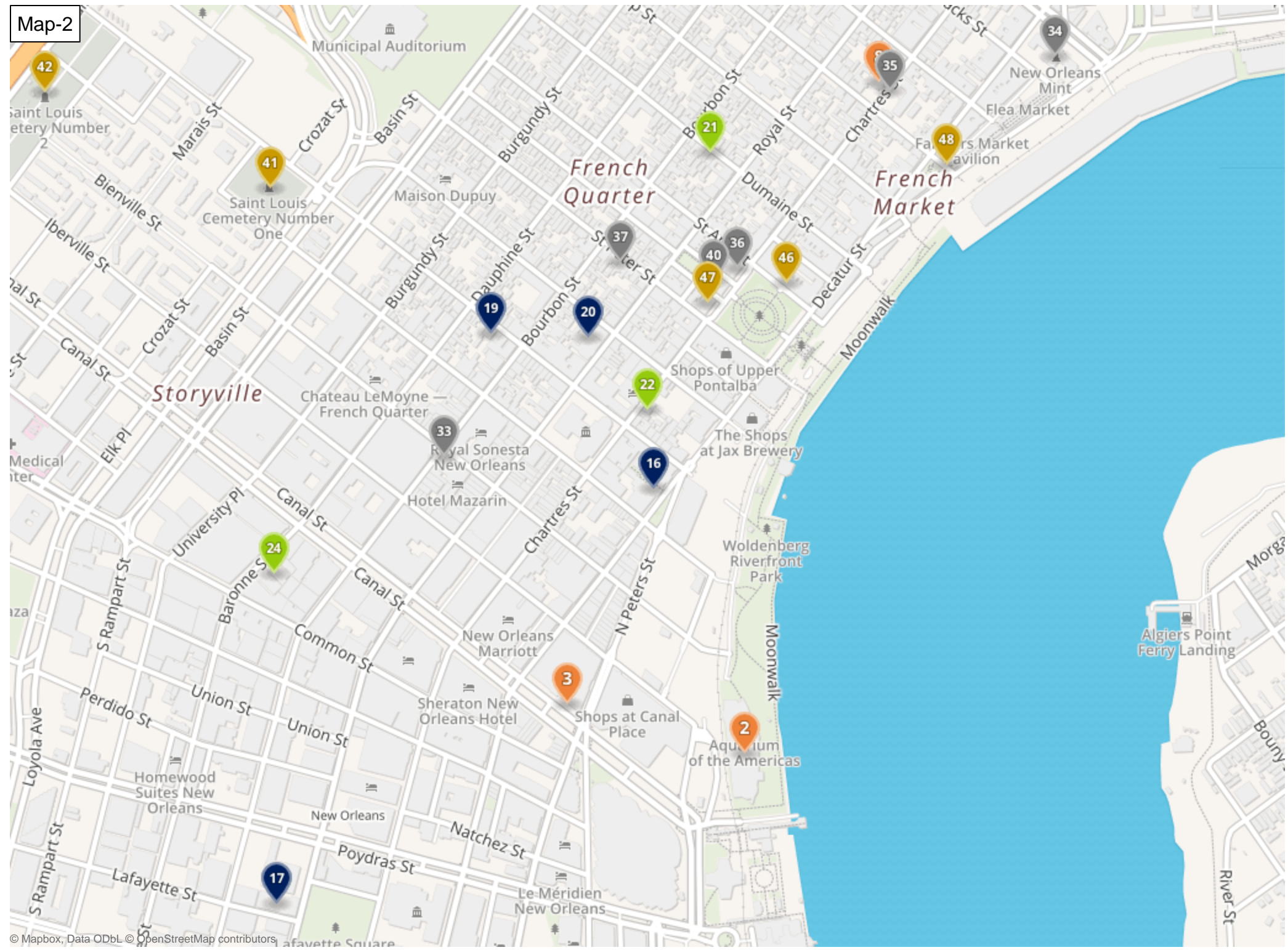
Map of Attractions

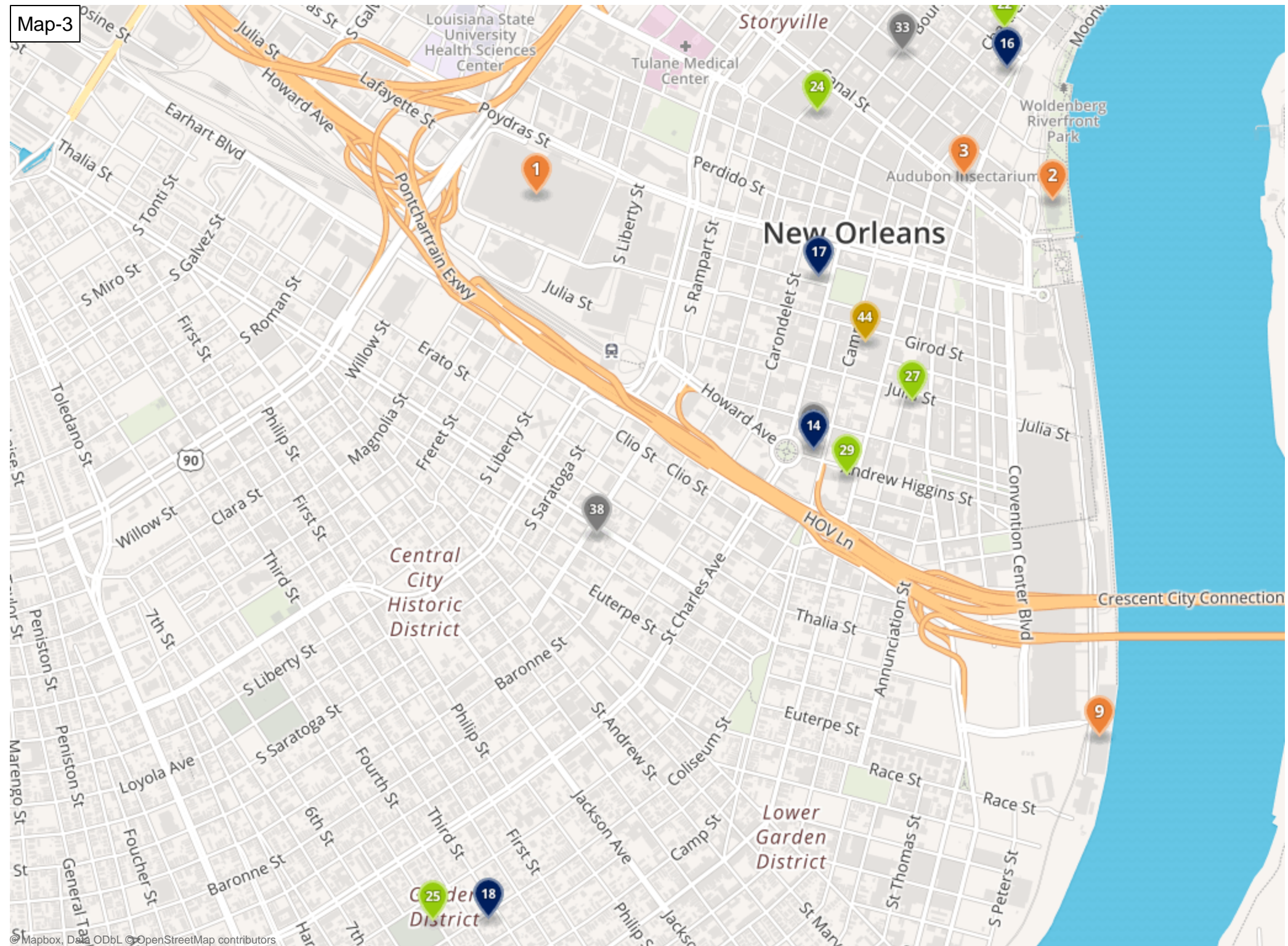

- 1** **Mercedes-Benz Superdome**
The sports stadium associated with Hurricane Katrina (Map-1,3)
- 2** **Audubon Aquarium of the Americas**
See aquatic animals in beautiful recreated natural environments (Map-1,2,3)
- 3** **Audubon Insectarium**
Learn about and get up close to many creepy crawlies and butterflies (Map-1,2,3)
- 4** **Audubon Park**
A beautiful park with a lagoon, stables, paths, playgrounds and green lawns (Map-1)
- 5** **Audubon Zoo**
See animals from around the world in recreated natural environments (Map-1)
- 6** **Backstreet Cultural Museum**
A collection of costumes and paraphernalia related to the Mardi Gras and jazz funerals (Map-1)
- 7** **Barataria Preserve**
Visit the Louisiana wetlands, follow the boardwalk past birds, animals and plants
- 8** **Beauregard-Keyes House**
Former historic home of General Beauregard furnished in the style of the 1860s (Map-1,2)
- 9** **Blaine Kern's Mardi Gras World**
See where Mardi Gras floats are created (Map-1,3)
- 10** **Botanical Garden City Park**
2,000 plants, themed gardens and art displays in City Park (Map-1)
- 11** **Carousel Gardens Amusement Park**
Amusement park in City Park with antique carousel and modern rides (Map-1)
- 12** **Chalmette Battlefield**
The Battle of New Orleans was fought here in 1815 (Map-1)
- 13** **City Park**
A park with 20,000 oak trees and 1½ times Central Park, dating back to 1853 (Map-1)
- 14** **Confederate Memorial Hall Museum**
Learn about the heritage and military history of the Confederate army (Map-1,3)
- 15** **Degas House**
Artist Edgar Degas lived here, see the house decorated in 1870s style (Map-1)
- 16** **French Quarter Visitor Center**
Learn about the city and specifically French Quarter through exhibits, films and illustrations (Map-1,2)
- 17** **Gallier Hall**
A furnished and decorated historic house from the 1850s (Map-1,2,3)
- 18** **Garden District**
Take a tour of a walk through the streets lined with Victorian mansions and palatial homes (Map-1,3)
- 19** **Hermann-Grima House**
Former 1830s home of German cotton dealer Samuel Hermann (Map-1,2)
- 20** **Historic New Orleans Collection**
A complex of properties highlighting the culture of the Southern Gulf and New Orleans (Map-1,2)
- 21** **Historic Voodoo Museum**
Learn of the mysterious practice of voodoo in New Orleans (Map-1,3)
- 22** **Historical Pharmacy Museum**
See recreated 19th century pharmacy and learn of weird early pharmaceutical practices (Map-1,2,3)
- 23** **Hurricane Katrina Memorial**
A memorial for the 1100 who died in 2005's Hurricane Katrina (Map-1)
- 24** **Immaculate Conception Church**
An 1840s Gothic-style church with beautiful interior (Map-1,2,3)
- 25** **Lafayette Cemetery No. 1**
Established in 1833, with fascinating tomb stones (Map-1,3)
- 26** **Longue Vue House & Gardens**
A large house museum and garden from 1942 (Map-1)
- 27** **Louisiana Childrens Museum**
Many hands-on, multi-media, interactive displays for kids to learn and have fun (Map-1,3)
- 28** **Metairie Cemetery**
Historic cemetery with 9,000 graves some of famous personalities (Map-1)
- 29** **National World War II Museum**
Focused on the US part in the liberation of Europe in WWII (Map-1,3)
- 30** **New Orleans Bayous**
Take a tour of the swamps and learn about the Cajun culture

New Orleans Museum of Art

NOMA holds 40,000 pieces, 600sBC-modern art including big names in the art world (Map-1)

Ogden Museum of Southern Art

Collections focused on the visual arts and culture of the Southern States (Map-1,3)

Old Absinthe House

Historic bar frequented by famous personalities - Twain, Wilde, Sinatra and more (Map-1,2,3)

Old U.S. Mint

Confederate and union currencies were minted here now a cultural exhibition center (Map-1,2)

Old Ursuline Convent

Historic convent complex (Map-1,2)

Presbytere

A Jesuit church with interesting art and architecture (Map-1,2)

Preservation Hall

Authentic New Orleans jazz venue dating back to 1961 (Map-1,2)

Southern Food and Beverage Museum

Learn of the blend of culinary cultures in New Orleans and Southern States (Map-1,2,3)

39

St. Augustine Church

This beautiful 1727 church with stunning interior overlooks Jackson Square (Map-1)

40

St. Louis Cathedral

A stunning cathedral and one of the city most famous landmarks (Map-1,2)

41

St. Louis Cemetery No. 1

An 1823 Creole cemetery with ancient vaults and tomb stones (Map-1,2)

42

St. Louis Cemetery No. 2

Established in 1854 this cemetery has ornate and beautiful tomb stones (Map-1,2)

43

St. Louis Cemetery No. 3

An 1840s Gothic-style church with beautiful interior (Map-1)

44

St. Patrick's Church

An 1833 church with beautiful eclectic architecture and decoration (Map-1,3)

45

Storyland City Park

Large sculptures of fairytale characters in City Park (Map-1)

46

The 1850 House

See a typical mid-19th century furnished home (Map-1,2)

47

The Cabildo

A 1799 building on Jackson Square holding exhibits on American history (Map-1,2)

The French Market

An open air market and entertainment hub popular with tourists and locals alike (Map-1,2)
